1. Call to order

8. Public comment

Kenneth Filarski, Filarski/Architecture+Planning+Research

Mr. Filarski stated that he was one of the original authors behind the GBA. He noted that the legislative changes that passed this year are intended to integrate the 2021 Act on Climate and the Executive Climate Change Coordinating Council (EC4) with the GBA. The new legislation was intentional in expanding the GBAC membership and to include representation from the EC4 agencies.

Melissa Travis, Rhode Island Manufacturers Association

Ms. Travis expressed concerns that the increased representation on the GBAC does not necessarily mean that those new representatives would have the knowledge or credentials related to green buildings.
